WHEREAS, the Fire District is the sponsor of a Length of Service Award Program (a "LOSAP") on behalf of the Manhasset-Lakeville Fire Department in accordance with Article 11-A of the New York State General Municipal Law (GML);

WHEREAS, General Municipal Law § 219-a(2)(d) requires the Board of Fire Commissioners (Board) to review and approve an annual list of volunteer firefighters that earned service credit for the prior year;

WHEREAS, When the LOSAP was initially adopted by the Fire District, participants who were over the entitlement age were not allowed to earn additional service credit;

WHEREAS, it was subsequently determined that firefighters over the entitlement age were eligible to earn additional service credit, and the Board took corrective action;

WHEREAS, participant Brian Levings reached the entitlement age and began collecting his monthly benefit effective January 1, 2006;

WHEREAS, after an internal review, it was discovered that Mr. Levings earned a year of service credit in calendar year 2006, which was his first year after reaching entitlement age, but due to an oversight was not properly credited with this service when the initial corrective action was taken by the Board;

WHEREAS, the Board desires to now approve the 2006 service credit earned by Mr. Levings; NOW, THEREFORE BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Board of Fire Commissioners approves awarding one (1) year of service credit earned by Brian Levings in calendar year 2006; and, be it further,

RESOLVED, that the District Secretary shall provide a copy of this resolution to Firefly Admin Inc., the third-party administrator for the LOSAP, with a request to correct Mr. Levings's service credit and take the necessary actions now required to adjust his monthly benefit.
